Itinerary-at-a-glance

Day 1: Saturday, June 26: LOS ANGELES - MADRID

Transfer on own from Los Angeles Area to LAX Airport for flight to Madrid, via Miami.

Day 2 – Sunday, June 27: ARRIVE MADRID – SALAMANCA (D)
Arrive at the Madrid Airport, and meet your transfer driver who will take you directly to Salamanca. Upon arrival, you will rendezvous with your host family at the school and then transfer to your home stay accommodations for your first dinner with the family.

Days 3-7: Monday through Friday, June 28-July 2: SALAMANCA (BLD)
Five days of Spanish instruction in Salamanca, 4 hours per day.

Days 8-9: Sat-Sun, July 3-4: SALAMANCA AT LEISURE (BLD)

Two full days for pursuing individual pursuits.

Days 10-14: Monday through Friday, July 5-9: SALAMANCA (BLD)

Five days of Spanish instruction in Salamanca, 4 hs/day.

Day 15: Saturday, July 10: SEGOVIA /LA GRANJA EXCURSION (BD)

Today enjoy a full day excursion with private motorcoach and guide to the fabled cities of Segovia and La Granja. Segovia typifies the glory of Old Castile, with its still functioning aqueduct from Roman times, and its “fairy-tale” El Alcazar Castle. Nearby La Granja was the summer palace of the Bourbon Kings who attempted to replicate the opulence of Versailles in Spain. Return to Salamanca in the late afternoon.

Day 16: Sunday, July 11: SALAMANCA AT LEISURE (BLD)

A full day for pursuing individual pursuits.

Days 17-21: Monday through Friday, July 12-16: SALAMANCA (BLD)

Five days of Spanish instruction in Salamanca, 4 hours per day.

Days 22-23: Sat-Sun, July 17-18: SALAMANCA AT LEISURE (BLD)

Two full days for pursuing individual pursuits.

Days 24-28: Monday through Friday, July 19-23: SALAMANCA (BLD)

Five days of Spanish instruction in Salamanca, 4 hours per day.

Day 29: Saturday, July 24: SALAMANCA – MADRID – LOS ANGELES (B)

A morning transfer from Salamanca will return the group to Madrid Airport for its return flights to Los Angeles.

ABOUT UPSA:

Pontifical University of Salamanca (UPSA) was founded in 1940 in order to maintain the old ecclesiastical faculties of the University of Salamanca. University of Salamanca itself was founded by King Alfonso IX of León in 1219 and was definitively established, in its twofold royal and pontifical character, by Alfonso X the Learned, in 1254. The university enrolls approximately 8,500 students and offers more than 40 official degrees, postgraduate courses. The principal site of the Pontifical University is situated in Salamanca, a university city of excellence, in which more than 40,000 university students live. Its streets are full of culture carved in stone, like the House of the Shells (la Casa de las Conchas) and the Cathedrals or the Main Square (la Plaza Mayor). Salamanca has been converted into a world icon of Spanish teaching, and for this reason every year thousands of foreign students approach the language of Cervantes in this beautiful city.
